

Wharfage for fresh seafood

For fish and shellfish that is unloaded from fishing vessels or transport containers, in natural or processed state, apply a fee of **2,4% of the first hand sales value**, to a maximum of DKK 27.000,- per landing. (A landing is defining as the total load from one individual vessel per call.)

Fees for fresh fish, etc. are paid by the buyer (auctioneer, the fishmonger, etc.). The buyer must provide the port with a basis of calculation in written form.

Due date of the fees after agreement with the Port, but latest a month after the landing.

The buyer is obliged to disclose specifications of the purchase to the port. These include the name of the shipmaster, the value and weight of the cargo and to whom it was sold.

It's the buyers and shipmasters duty to inform the Port of Hvide Sande about landings with a gross value of more than DKK 1.125.000, - if they want the maximum fee of DKK 27.000,- to be applied.

Unloading fish for transit

Unloading fish for transit are fish etc. unloaded to lorries and transported to auctions, buyers or processors outside the Port of Hvide Sande.

For transit landings, the Hvide Sande portcontrol **must** be contacted at least 1 hour before ETA, on tel. 97 97 16 16 33, or on E-mail: portcontrol@hvshavn.dk

The vessel must, before call or immediately afterwards, submit registration containing:

- Ship data
- Shipowner, name, address, contact information, and banker
- Receiver of the fish, Company name, address, contact information, and banker
- The species, quantity, and expected value of the fish.
- The consignee must be, approved by the port, auction, buyer or processor.
Port of Hvide Sande may require collateral for the expected value tax.

The consignee must specify calculation for the fee, and is required, upon request, to provide specification on the landing, and the skipper of the vessel, on request of the port, are required to provide in writing the value and weight of the landing.

Fee, and other services, are not invoiced to private / shipowners, but only through Danish agent, approved auction, fish buyer or processing company.

If seafood is not sold primarily through a fish auction and if the value of the landing sold is less, compared to the average price of selected fish auctions on the same day, Port of Hvide Sande can issue an additional bill of 2.4% of the difference.
